Reflections on the Sunday Gospel-Term 4

The liturgy of the Catholic Church provides a framework for reflection which is used by Catholics throughout the world. This term we shall reflect upon the gospel reading for Sunday during the week. The readings are a great context for reflection.

Sunday 12 October Matt 22:1-10

Last Sunday's reading about the wedding was a very significant event for the king and his family. The people invited to the wedding chose to do other things rather than attend. Their preoccupation with their own activities led them to ignore the significance of this event for the king.

REFLECTION/ACTION.

The significant events of our lives and those of others are an integral part of the life we have been gifted by God.

Commemorating birth, committing to a state of life and celebrating anniversaries, and honouring those who have died are all ways of reconnecting with our human nature and relationships. Participating fully nurtures both our soul and our relationships.

Creating space in our lives for the celebration of life honours the God who gave us life.

RE PROGRAMME - TERM 4

From the recently released Bishops document "The Catholic Education of School Aged Children"

Religious Education belongs to the stage of 'growth in knowledge'...All students, whatever their level of faith development, need some understanding of the theological content of their faith, not just an understanding of the cultural elements of Catholics. For those students who already have a committed relationship with Jesus Christ the religious education programme must deliver at the level needed to sustain their desires to grow in knowledge and understanding (para 61)

Our Religious Education Programme is taught to achieve what is in the above paragraph through the RE Strands and Modules.

The term starts with a week's study on Traditional prayer and every class will be working from the Prayer Module at their appropriate level.

There is only one major strand for the term which is the COMMUNION OF SAINTS Level 1 to Level 4. Each level has a topic of focus.

Once again you shall be informed of the content of studies in each class through your child's RE exercise book which will be sent home on a regular basis with home activities to be completed with your support. This exercise enables you to understand the learning objectives and to be informed of what your child is learning in RE.

Towards the end of the term we shall also be looking Liturgical Year studies of Advent and Christmas to celebrate the birth of Jesus but more importantly, becoming more aware of His second coming.

The Family Whanau book is an invaluable resource for parents to have at home as it gives you all the necessary information about the RE programme from Year 1 to Year 8. You may access it online or borrow one from the school office.

We look forward to celebrating our Masses and assemblies which you will be informed of through the weekly school newsletters.

Thanks to all of you who provide a daily commitment to God by practising your faith and setting an example for your children. We appreciate your support.

The Mission fair was wonderful and I thank you again for your support and generosity towards the deprived children in our world.
