# Sunday 26 October

#### Matt 22:34-40

Last Sunday's Gospel reading is about the greatest and the first commandment. When one of the Pharisees asked Jesus, 'Master, which is the greatest commandment of the Law?'

Jesus said, ' You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the greatest and the first commandment

### **REFLECTION/ACTION.**

In reflecting on this passage from Matthew's gospel, in the sentence about loving God, there is a very strong statement about how we are to love God, which can be overlooked. "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind".

In Psalm 22 these well-known words make a great act of faith:

"He guides me along the right path; he is true to his name. If I should walk in the valley of darkness no evil will I fear. You are there with your crook and your staff; with these you give me comfort."

Making an act of faith in this way nourishes the seeking soul, stabilizes a heart in danger of being swamped by negative emotions, and occupies a doubting mind. It integrates all these aspects of our human nature. It is a complete response to the first great commandment.
