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Board of Trustee Elections

Elections will be occurring throughout New Zealand for all schools, and these elections give you the chance to nominate and vote for who you would like to represent you on the Board for the next three years.



The Board consists of four Bishops representatives, five parent representatives, the principal, and a staff representative. Nominations are called for the five parent representatives positions.

For the continuing good governance of the school we need trustees who are willing to offer their time and their skills, and who represent the variety of perspectives and experiences that can be found in our school community. You are not required to be an expert, but you do need to be responsible and enthusiastic and be prepared to spend time attending monthly Board meetings (and other meetings as necessary), plus training sessions as appropriate, and to take responsibility for getting things done when needed.

You can participate in the election process in any of the following three ways:

1. By nominating someone
2. By being prepared to stand for election




