The past is our treasure and it is important to know our past events and what they mean. The bread of life gospel reading on Sunday is no different. To understand that reading we need to know the story of Moses as his stories occur so much in what Jesus says and does.

Faith Facts

August 6 – The Transfiguration: Jesus and three of his apostles, Peter, James and John, go to a mountain (the <u>Mount of Transfiguration</u>). On the mountain, Jesus begins to shine with bright rays of light. Then the prophets <u>Moses</u> and <u>Elijah</u> appear next to him and he speaks with them. Jesus is then called "<u>Son</u>" by <u>God the Father</u>... The Transfiguration is one of the <u>miracles of Jesus</u> in the Gospels. The Transfiguration is one of the five major milestones in the gospel narrative of the life of <u>Jesus</u>, the others being <u>Baptism</u>, <u>Crucifixion</u>, <u>Resurrection</u>, and <u>Ascension</u>.

Laudato Si'

What is unique about this encyclical? First, it is the only encyclical devoted to environmentalism. Second, virtually all encyclicals are addressed to the bishops of the Catholic Church, sometimes with added groups. Laudato Si' is different as it is addressed to every person on the planet. This means, unlike any previous encyclical, only a minority of its intended audience is Catholic. (Catholics make up a little more than one billion of the seven billion people alive.) Thirdly, the encyclical does not simply propose views that all are expected to accept because of the Pope's religious authority. Instead, he invites the people of the world to a dialogue on the subject of environmentalism, writing: In this encyclical, I would like to enter into dialogue with all people about our common home.

GOSPEL: John 6:41-51

Meanwhile the Jews were complaining to each other about him, because he had said, 'I am the bread that has come down from heaven.' They were saying, 'Surely this is Jesus son of Joseph, whose father and mother we know. How can he now say, "I have come down from heaven?" Jesus said in reply to them, 'Stop complaining to each other. No one can come to me unless drawn by the Father who sent me, and I will raise that person up on the last day. It is written in the prophets: They will all be taught by God; everyone who has listened to the Father, and learnt from him, comes to me. Not that anybody has seen the Father, except him who has his being from God: he has seen the Father. In all truth I tell you, everyone who believes has eternal life. I am the bread of life. Your fathers ate manna in the desert and they are dead; but this is the bread which comes down from heaven, so that a person may eat it and not die. I am the living bread which has come down from heaven. Anyone who eats this bread will live for ever; and the bread that I shall give is my flesh, for the life of the world.'
