THOUGHTS

Attendance at school is a legal requirement and in the 2014 school environment an electronic roll is taken twice a day. All pupil absences are recorded and all unexplained absences are followed up with a text or phone call from the office requesting a reason for the pupils absence.

The absence rate of all pupils is monitored by NETS (Truancy Service) The trigger for intervention is 21% absence and in extreme cases legal action is taken against the parents or caregivers for prolonged absence.

At St Anne's I will always talk to you if a situation develops that could result in the truancy service becoming involved. The simple truth is that children need to be at school to learn. If you are keeping children at home for an invalid reason it is not good enough!

This spring weather gives us real hope for good times ahead.



The form is to be returned whether children are attending or not.



- ◊ Mystery prizes




