ASH WEDNESDAY

A week today is the start of lent. We mark it by receiving the Ashes from the burnt leaves from Palm Sunday last year. We would love you to join us for this Mass. If you have never been before it is a little bit different to a normal service as each person receives a cross on their forehead made with the ashes. Catholics then begin Lent where we often give up something to show our commitment to our faith. A little bit like the 40hr famine but 40 days. We teach that during Lent we should fast, pray and give alms more. Start talking now about what you as a family could 'fast' from. Maybe TV, maybe phones out once school/work finishes, maybe unhealthy food, maybe 'half empty' phrases etc. Why? Less time on Facebook or watching TV will mean more family time, more helping one another with the chores (almsgiving) and nothing is more Catholic than loving one another more and more. WHAT ARE YOU GOING TO FAST FROM? CAN YOU LAST 40 DAYS? Also, traditionally Catholics who had received their First Communion would abstain from eating meat on a Friday, now days it is lighter meals on a Friday but still abstain from eating meat on Good Friday. This is more of an adult thing though if students are confused. It would be a nice idea to give them vegetarian lunches on a Friday though.

LUNCHES

A gentle reminder that we are now a **Waste free school**. Please leave **all** wrapping at home. Last year we were, 'pack in, pack out' but now we are waste free. Please support this initiative from the Enviro team which has was supported by the Board of Trustees. WHY? It drops out of lunchboxes by accident and flies out of lunchboxes in the wind causing a lot of rubbish **around** the school. Also, unhealthy food tends to be 'wrapped' so we are hoping it leads to better choices of food for lunch.

BOOKING YOUR STUDENT LED CONFERENCE

- 1. Go to <u>parentinterviews.co.nz</u>, enter the event code U8TPG and click Go.
- 2. Enter your name, email address and the names of the students you wish to make bookings for.
- 3. Select the teachers you'd like to book by ticking the checkbox beside their name, and then click the 'Book Interviews' button at the bottom of the page.
- 4. Using the timetable, click the 'Book button' beside the time slot you'd like to book for the teacher. You'll be asked to confirm your booking.
- 5. Continue until you've booked all teachers.

Once you're finished, you can view your timetable by clicking 'My Interviews' at the top of the page. You can also print a PDF timetable to take to your interviews. Before your interviews, you'll receive an email reminder containing your timetable. If you need to cancel any interviews, you can do so by following the link in the email you received when you first signed up.

Each interview is 15 minutes long. Please ensure you arrive on time to each interview.

Remember, students will be leading the conference, sharing what they have been doing to start the year, their goals, and will tell you all about the classroom and how it is run.
