IS YOUR FAMILY FLU STRONG?

Has your family had their annual flu shot. Influenza causes serious illness and spreads rapidly in a school environment and from there into homes and the wider community.

Our young people can also be vulnerable as their immune system may never have had to fight a flu infection. To reduce the spread and the impact of flu on our young people, seasonal Influenza vaccination is again being offered <u>free</u> in Canterbury to anyone from 6 months to 18 years of age. Vaccination is the only effective protection against the flu and is available through your general practice team now. Get flu strong this winter.

Emergency Contact

Winter is a timely reminder for you to check that the school office has your correct contact details.

It is important that we are able to contact you, or your nominated emergency contact, particularly during winter when weather can be unpredictable and children can become unwell during the day with winter ills. Please make contact with the school office or return the slip below to confirm your current contact details.

School Closure—If for any reason the school needs to close during school hours parents/caregivers will immediately be advised via phone, text message and Facebook notification. Until contact is made the children will remain at school, with supervision, until parents collect them or make alternative arrangements.
