Reading 1— Isaiah 55: 1-3

Reading 2— Romans 8: 35, 37-39

Gospel— Matthew 14: 13-21

This particular reading is on forgiveness. Peter asks Jesus how he should forgive those who sin against him... and Jesus replies not seven times but seventy seven times. And then goes on to tell the story of the king taking pity on the servant who owed him money, and freeing him of the debt.

RE PROGRAMME - TERM 3

From the recently released Bishops document "The Catholic Education of School Aged Children"

Religious Education belongs to the stage of 'growth in knowledge'...All students, whatever their level of faith development, need some **understanding** of the theological content of their faith, not just an understanding of the cultural elements of Catholics. For those students who already have a committed relationship with Jesus Christ the religious education programme must **deliver at the level needed to sustain their desires to grow in knowledge and understanding** (para 61)

Our Religious Education Programme is taught to achieve what is in the above paragraph through the RE Strands and Modules.

The major strands for the term will be SACRAMENT and JESUS Level 1 to Level 4. The students will be involved in active ways to expand their knowledge and apply their learning in their every day lives.

You shall be informed of the content of studies in each class through your child's RE exercise book which will be sent home on a regular basis with home activities to be completed with your support. This exercise enables you to understand the learning objectives and to know what your child is learning in RE.

We shall also be studying another part of the Prayer Module –Imaginative as well as the Assumption in the Liturgical Year module.

Towards the end of the term we shall also be looking at the social justice theme for 2014 in preparation for the Mission Fair in the last week of the term.

The Family Whanau book is an invaluable resource for parents to have at home as it gives you all the necessary information about the RE programme from Year 1 to Year 8. It is available online or you can borrow one from the school office.

We look forward to celebrating our Masses and assemblies which you will be informed of through the weekly school newsletters.

Thanks to all of you who provide a daily commitment to God by practising the gift of faith and setting an example for your children. We appreciate your support.
