I'm not going, but this paper newsletter is.

Why? Environmental reason—Brought up by the students, currently we use about 6000 pieces a paper a year on newsletters. This doesn't fit with our waste free, environmentally friendly stance. Many of these don't even make it home (lost etc).

Why? Cost reason—This change will also reduce copying costs and in turn more money for other things. When we went 'waste free' for lunches, within a year, I was able to buy new sports equipment for all the classes with the money saved from skip emptying costs. Same applies here.

Why? Cultural reason—In Māori (and many Pasifika) terms, all living things, including the natural and physical resources, possess a mauri (life principle or life force). Each iwi has responsibilities and obligations (mainly in its own area) for environment management of the taonga (important resources). Therefore, tree use, merely for the convenience, doesn't sit with the tikanga of managing the taonga of our forests and wildlife within them.

What will we do?

Pentecost

Pentecost always occurs 50 days after the death and resurrection of Jesus, and ten days after his ascension into heaven. Because Easter is a moveable feast without a fixed date, and Pentecost depends on the timing of Easter, Pentecost can fall anywhere between May 10 and June 13. This year we celebrated Pentecost on Sunday 9 June. The name of the day itself is derived from the Greek word pentecoste, meaning 50th. Pentecost is the celebration of the person of the Holy Spirit coming upon the Apostles, Mary, and the first followers of Jesus, who were gathered together in the Upper Room.

The Holy Spirit also gave the apostles the other gifts and fruits necessary to fulfil the great commission - to go out and preach the Gospel to all nations.
