Parking Outside School Gate

The Hagley/Ferrymead Community Board has approved the school's request for parking restrictions outside the school. When these signs are erected P3 (3 minutes, which is the standard restriction time outside schools) will be enforced between 8.15–9.15 am and 2.30—3.30pm Mon—Fri. This will make it a much safer drop off and pick up option for our students. We are grateful for the 100% support we received from nearby businesses and residents..
