Faith Facts - Cloud & Light

These two images occur together in the manifestations of the Holy Spirit. In the theophanies of the old Testament, the cloud, now luminous, reveals the living and saving God, while veiling the transcendence of his glory—with Moses on Mount Sinai, a the tend of meeting, and during the wandering in the desert, and with Solomon at the dedication of the Temple. In the Holy Spirit, Christ fulfils these figures. The Spirit comes upon the Virgin Mary and "overshadows" her, so that she might conceive and give birth to Jesus. On the mountain of Transfiguration, the Spirit in the "cloud came and overshadowed" Jesus, Moses and Elijah, Peter, James and John and "a voice came out of the cloud, saying, 'This is my Son, my Chosen; listen to him!" Finally, the cloud took Jesus our of the sight of the disciples on the day of his ascension and will reveal him as Son of man in glory on the day of his final coming.

What we are doing

- intersection. Works will commence on the evening of Sunday 8 June 2014 and will take approximately two We will be replacing a section of wastewater main at the Ferry Road / Rutherford Street / Palinurus Road weeks to complete.
- Due to the large traffic volume through this intersection, works will take place at night between the hours of 6.00pm and 6.00am.
- Wastewater repairs on Rutherford Street will follow at a later date, further information will be provided prior to this work commencing.
- During work hours the intersection will be closed for traffic travelling through the intersection on Ferry Road and no right hand turns will be available. Sign posted detours will be in place, details are over the page.

How our work could impact you

Traffic Impacts

- Due to the high traffic volume at this intersection, works will take place at night between the hours of 6.00pm until 6.00am
- There will be no thorough route for traffic travelling east or west on Ferry Road during work hours.
- When travelling east (towards Sumner) on Ferry Road please follow the detour via Palinurus Road, Dyers Road and then back onto Ferry Road.
- When travelling west (towards the city) on Ferry Road please follow the detour via Rutherford Street, Garlands Road, Radley Street and then Ferry Road.
- The following no right hand turns will be in place throughout the work period (both day and night)
- Ferry Road onto Palinurus Road
- Ferry Road onto Rutherford Street
- Palinurus Road onto Ferry Road
- Rutherford Street onto Ferry Road
- As work is taking place in the intersection, access to your property will not be affected.
- During the day the fencing will be pulled in to allow two way traffic flow on Ferry Road. Please note that due to the location of the work site the no right hand turns will remain in place
- temporarily relocated during these works. Details of the temporary stop will be available at the original bus The bus stops on Ferry Road, either side of the Rutherford Street and Palinurus intersection will be stop location. General Impacts

- You should expect to experience some levels of noise and vibration, however this will be monitored and managed accordingly. We will also be using high beam safety lights while we work.
- pipes and replacing these with new pipes. Open trenching will require the placement of trench shields and Due to the location of the pipes this work involves trenching in the middle of the road to remove damaged fencing to ensure our workers remain safe.
- We will be using construction machinery, pumps, concrete saws, compacting machines and other pieces of equipment as part of this work.
- There will be no expected interruptions to your existing water, wastewater, power, gas or telecommunication services while we undertake this work.
- Works will take place between the hours of 6.00pm and 6.00am.
- All works are subject to favourable weather and on-site conditions.
