Are your children arriving before 8.30am? To reinforce my comments from a few weeks ago, you are advised that the school is open from 8.30am to 3.30pm. If your child comes to school before this, please be aware this is at your own risk and we ask that it does not happen. If you need to drop them off before 8.30am due to work commitments, we understand this, so please see Mrs Parker in the Mission Centre (if you haven't already). Mrs Parker kindly allows students to wait in her room and do Mathletics and Reading Eggs etc. until 8.30am. Once you have discussed the need for your child to be at school earlier with her, we ask that you walk them to her class daily. This is just in case she is unwell and to check another teacher is in the school, and to make sure they arrive safely. We are concerned for the safety of the children and also for the workload of Mrs Parker as she shouldn't have to care for students who could have come at the correct time. We appreciate your understanding here. If you have any questions, please pop into see me.

Contact Details/Consent forms: There is still **40** forms to be returned. It is really important that these are completed and returned immediately so we can update contact details in case of an emergency. The ICT Acceptable Use contract is renewed each year and students who have not returned their forms will not be permitted to access ICT equipment at school until the form is returned.

Homework: We are looking into our homework systems as a school at present. As a research based school, we like evidence that what we do is the best way to do it. In terms of homework, we commonly think, the more we do the better we must be, surely. There has been much research done on homework. There are also annoying summaries on pages like 'Stuff' that claim research or to summarise research just to stir some feedback.
