

3rd SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR B

SUNDAY GOSPEL 8 March John 2:13-22

In this Gospel Jesus becomes angry when he sees the temple, the house of God, used for activities that do not properly belong there.



REFLECTION/DISCUSSION:

The happenings in the Temple turned into marketplace show us what the results are of a love of God that has lost sight of the neighbour.

ACTION

The Ten Commandments recognise our dependence on God and the rights of our neighbour. By keeping them we can in a positive way show our love for God and our neighbour.

4th SUNDAY OF LENT YEAR B

SUNDAY GOSPEL 15 March John 3:16-17

In this Gospel we hear how God loves to rescue people and give them second chances. It emphasizes that God saves through love rather than condemnation. Any image of God as fierce, judgmental and condemning is a false one set up

by those with unhealed condemnation in their own hearts.

REFLECTION/DISCUSSION:

Reflect on what God's life-giving love does for us weak, sinful humans and on our joyful



obligation in faith and hope to feed, clothe, shelter, and visit those in need.

We do not earn God's love or mercy; it is something that is there, a free gift for the taking, the fruits of faith. It is by grace that we are saved, not by anything we ourselves have done.

<u>ACTION</u>

Touch a cross and say this prayer : "Thank you for loving us and staying with us. Help us to stay with you."
