Dear Parents & Caregivers

Our Religious Education Program is a continuing journey of faith. It is one that begins in the home and is reinforced at school through the RE programme. One of our main objectives is to teach the students the basic principles of the Catholic faith, however, giving meaning to the rituals and symbols of our faith is not enough. It is up to you, as parents, to provide a daily commitment to God by practising the gift of faith and setting an example for your children. Our efforts will be effective only if they are combined with your efforts.

The major strands for the term will be HOLY SPIRIT and JESUS Level 1 to Level 4. The students will be involved in active ways to expand their knowledge and apply their learning through their actions and thoughts.

You will be informed of the content of studies in each class through your child's RE exercise book which will be sent home on a regular basis with home activities to be completed with your support. This exercise enables you to understand the learning objectives. It is important that you know and are involved with what your child is learning in RE.

We will also be studying another part of the Prayer Module – Traditional Prayers, as well as Easter, The Ascension and Pentecost in the Liturgical Year module.

The Family Whanau book is an invaluable resource for parents to have at home as it gives you all the necessary information about the RE programme from Year 1 to Year 8. You can buy it or borrow one from the school office.

I look forward to celebrating our Masses and assemblies which you will be informed of through the weekly school newsletters. Thanks for your on-going support.

Faith Facts

EASTER

The Easter season begins on the evening of Easter Sunday and continues for fifty days, ending on the evening of Pentecost Sunday. The eight days following Easter are observed as the Octave of Easter and each day has the same solemnity as a Sunday. If another solemnity falls during the octave it is transferred to the following Monday.

The fifty days between Easter and Pentecost are a time of joy and thanksgiving for what Christ has done for humanity. The paschal candle is in a prominent place in the sanctuary of the church and is lit for all liturgical celebrations.

The liturgical colour for most of the Easter season is white.
