Sunday 23 November GOSPEL READING - Matt 25:31-46

Last Sunday we celebrated the feast of Christ the King. The Gospel reading reminded us that at the end of time, this king will come in glory to judge the living and the dead. He will ask how we treated the hungry and thirsty, the stranger, the naked, those sick or in prison.

Reflection and Action

We might find that we didn't see Jesus when we encountered someone who needed our time. Instead we saw the backlog of our work needing to be done. On a day when parenthood seemed particularly difficult we didn't see Jesus in a child who needed an expression of our love. But we might also find that that we didn't see Jesus in the person who gave us wise advice; or the person who arrived just when we needed help, or the relative who took the children out and provided some much needed space; or the boss who told us to go home early because we had a cold.

Pope Francis invites us all to share the joy of God's gift of the Gospel to others. The quotes this term will be from the beginning pages of Apostolic Exhortation of Pope Francis –Evangelii Gaudium, the Joy of the Gospel

Memory is a dimension of our faith which we might call "deuteronomic", not unlike the memory of Israel itself. Jesus leaves us the Eucharist as the Church's daily remembrance of, and deeper sharing in, the event of his Passover (cf. Lk 22:19). The joy of evangelising always arises from grateful remembrance: it is a grace which we constantly need to implore. (EG 13)
