The readings show us that God cannot be outdone in generosity and we are called to match this generosity.

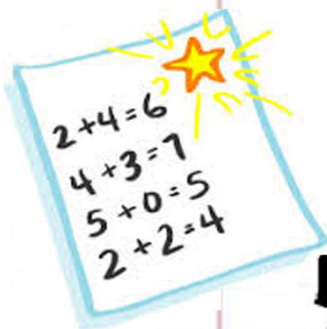
Gospel Mark 12: 41-44
