

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Gospel: Mark 9:38-41

In this Gospel Jesus places great importance on people giving good example and following others good example. Jesus also wants us to learn to be tolerant of both our own and other people's faults and their gifts – that means celebrating their successes and forgiving their failings. Being tolerant can sometimes be tough.

Reflection and Discussion

- Have you ever felt jealous of someone else, maybe even complained to someone about them? Maybe you feel that they think they are better than you?
- Sometimes people only want to hear their own side of the story, and they think every-one else has got it wrong.
- It can be easy to exclude others so that we can belong to the right group how does it feel to be left out?
- How do we know the difference between doing right and wrong?

Jesus wants us to learn to be tolerant of both other's faults and their gifts – that means celebrating their successes and forgiving their failings. Being tolerant can sometimes be tough.
