Whilst we promote being humble, I want to celebrate the achievements we have made this year in this newsletter. For us, it was not a 'throw away year' but one full of gains for us as a school. It has made me more excited for our future than ever before. 'Gains' is a positive term used by people who workout at the gym so I thought I would use this word to celebrate our 'gains'!

### Professional Development/Learning Gains

ATHOLIC SCHOOL

This year we have continued our digital fluency, literacy and te reo  $M\bar{a}ori$  development.

The lockdown made us really focus on how e-learning and distance learning would look at St Anne's. Our teachers made huge gains here and provided an exciting programme for our learners. Once we returned, we continued to look into the digital technologies curriculum. We look forward to using the \$5000 worth of brand new Spheros (robotics) next year to further enhance this knowledge.

This year we also implemented a two-tier phonics programme into the school. You may have heard all about this in the news and all the schools picking up on the research of phonics and decodable texts next year at some point. It is great knowing that the programmes guiding this, we have been doing over the past three years and have it working well at school. Our new teachers will get the latest PD on this next year also.

I was so thankful to have a term off to work with Ngāi Tahu on a programme called Te Poupou Reo o Tahu. The study strengthened my fluency in te reo Māori, and helped me gain more knowledge of the history of New Zealand and especially around where we live. It was great to be in an environment where I could not use english at all from 9am-3pm, I now know what it is like for many of our students who have english as a second language. Josh Halkett and Hazel Harnett-Garbes also have the opportunity next year to particitpate in this programme. We have also had three classes in immersion Māori environments, learning PE, music and other curriculum areas through Māori. There is no doubt Māori language is on the rise and again, it is great to be the school others are reaching out to for ideas.

- We farewell Helen Battersby who has been running a Reading Recovery Programme at school for a number of years. We thank her for all she has done for the children she has taught.

- Lastly, we farewell Judi Parker—Regularly, every year ex students return to St Anne's to see their old school. I walk out, excited to see ex-students, thinking maybe they are here to see me. We get into some small talk, and within 30 seconds, without fail, they say, "Is Mrs Parker around?". Judi is a teacher who students remember, respect and love. She has the X-factor as we say, and it will be missed. She has run our Kapahaka group for years and somehow manages to include almost the whole school. She has been working hard, helping us set up for when she leaves by passing on the knowledge and skills she has, and we thank her for that. I was asked, "Who's replacing Judi?" I said, "No-one can replace Judi", they rephrased to "Who is going to be next year's Year 7/8 teacher?" and the conversation continued. More will be said at prizegiving, but just noting here, this is a loss to our school.

We have a few staffing challenges next year with two teachers having a term on study leave and our new deputy principal starting midway through the year. We will endeavour to ensure learning continues and children enjoy the different skillset that other teachers provide. 
